## Peter Singer, "Animal Liberation, 25 Years On"

Dear ARH member:

Animal Rights Hawaii, in cooperation with the Vegetarian Society of Hawaii, is proud to announce that Peter Singer, world renowned philosopher and animal rights pioneer, will soon be our guest in Hawaii and will be giving presentations on both Oahu and Maui.

Professor Singer will be appearing at the McCoy Pavilion at Ala Moana Beach Park on Saturday, September 1, 2001, at 7 pm, and at Maui Community College on Tuesday, September 4, also at 7 pm.

Dr. Singer will present the core ideas of his book, <u>Animal Liberation</u>, first published in 1975 and widely regarded as the key text in the development of the modern animal movement. He will then consider what has happened since the book appeared and where the animal movement should go in the future.

Peter Singer was educated at the University of Melbourne and at Oxford. He is the Ira W. DeCamp Professor of Bioethics at the University Center of Human Values at Princeton. His resume consists of 35 pages of appointments, board positions, distinctions, awards, and an extensive list of his publications. Well-known internationally, Professor Singer is considered by many as the father of the modern animal rights movement.

We truly hope you will be able to attend Dr. Singer's presentation, in my opinion, a once in a lifetime chance to see the most remarkable animal advocate of our time.
