

Benefit for Leilani Farm Sanctuary at Max World Bistro in Haiku

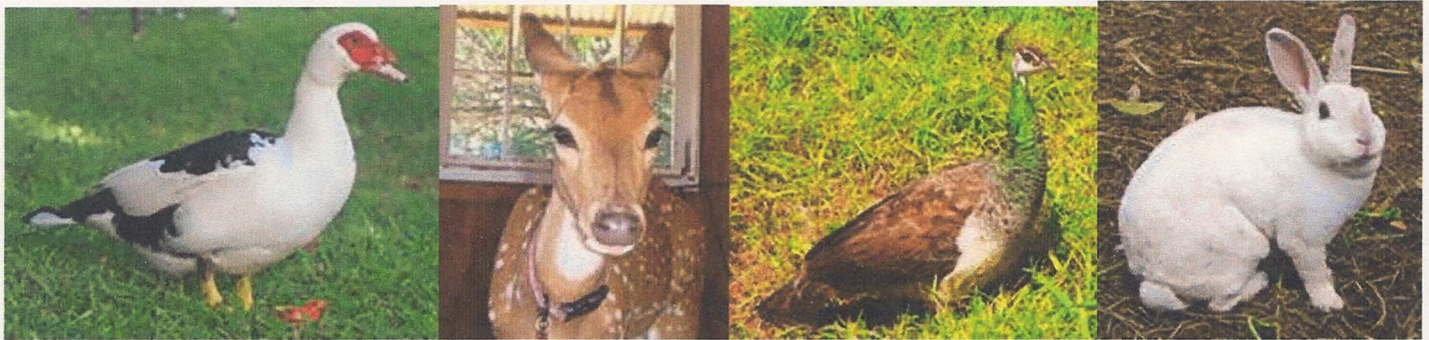

Leilani Farm Sanctuary is located on nearly eight heavenly acres of tropical land, and home to goats, cats, chickens, donkeys, ducks, peahens, and rabbits. The sanctuary was named in honor of Leilani, the farm's first resident donkey. It is an all volunteer, non-profit organization created to provide shelter and care for abused and rescued animals, and humane education to the community.
